

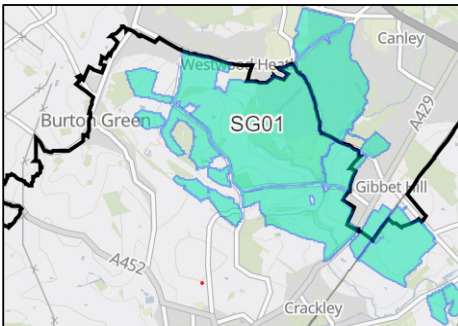

Have your say on proposals for new house building



Make sure your voice is heard on plans for new homes.

You have an opportunity to give your views on proposals for new housing sites in the area. The South Warwickshire Local Plan consultation,

that is now open for comments, enables you to have a say on the location of housing and employment land for the next 25 years. The Government is imposing a build rate of 1062 units each year for our area. **This potentially impacts Burton Green due to a proposed large development between the village and Coventry.**

We understand the need for more homes, but **it's crucial that the Green Belt is protected**

as much as possible, and that local people have a real say on which sites should be agreed for new homes. It's also vital that local issues with roads, schools, shops and doctors' surgeries are all factored into the decisions.

Not all the proposed sites will be needed, so this is your chance to make your voice heard on the proposals before decisions are taken. Burton Green Parish Council recently hosted a public meeting to discuss the issues. I was there to listen to views from the community. If you are concerned about the plans, you have until 7th March to give your views. Scan the QR code, log in, register, click on 4, and scroll to Table 5 to comment on individual sites.

Action on traffic chaos



The Liberal Democrats are demanding action to reduce disruption and improve safety on local roads.

The Conservative-led Warwickshire County Council has recently approved more road closures to facilitate HS2 construction, including upcoming closures on the A46 and the A429.

The council's delayed and over-budget A46 Stoneleigh bridge project, originally costing £40m has now had

another £16m allocated to it due to cost overruns, with no completion date in site.

Kenilworth School also suffers from significant traffic congestion due to a poorly designed car park and inadequate road safety planning, contributing to several accidents.

Liberal Democrat councillors are actively pushing the Council to develop a comprehensive plan to ensure the safety of pupils and road users.
