Councillor Sidney Syson is delighted that so many Milverton residents have responded to the South Warwickshire Local Plan (SWLP) Preferred Options Consultation. The Green Belt to the North of Milverton is highly valued by local residents and that is shown in the vast majority of responses from the Milverton area.

Sidney said, "The Green Belt is valued by many not just as a beautiful and peaceful space where dogs can be walked on the public footpaths, but also as fine farmland that does provide a buffer between Coventry and the surrounding towns and villages."

She added, "We believe that the town would have real difficulty with the extra traffic moving from new houses north of Leamington to the shops and jobs to the south of the town."

Elizabeth Park

Planning permission has now been granted for the new Elizabeth Park at Edmondscote Field. Councillor Dave Brunson says, "There was in-depth public consultation last year and this is the result. It will mean in due course the moving of the athletics track. Some years ago Guide Dogs for the Blind got permission to redevelop their site and as part of that permission they would give their land in the flood plain to the Council as parkland – making an unbroken string of parks by the Leam from Potterton Fields to Offchurch."

Still Closed!



Councillor Jennifer McAllister says, "After the temporary reopening of Lillington Avenue, the road is now closed again as Severn Trent finish essential work to clean up the Leam. Severn Trent at the moment say that Lillington Avenue (see above) will remain closed till the end of March. We will have to wait and see!"

Councillor Bill Gifford is talking to County Council officers about the possibility of reducing the speed limit on Old Milverton Road and the surrounding streets to 20mph.

Bill points out, "Old Milverton Road is a walking route to Brookhurst Primary School and Trinity School via the allotments, and walking to school should be encouraged by being made safer."

He added, "To my surprise, I am told by the WCC officers that in order to get a 20mph speed limit there will need to be evidence that the average speed of cars travelling on Old Milverton Road is less that 24mph. I have asked that the County checks the average speed. I am hoping that the speed humps will help keep the speeds down."

Unitary Authorities and Town Councils

Though Warwickshire County Council and the five Warwickshire Boroughs and Districts were not chosen by the Government to be in the first wave of new unitary authorities, the Government is keen for them to be in the next wave.

Town Councillor Simon Keay (pictured) says "Not enough thought has yet gone into the future role and responsibilities that a Town Council may want or receive. It is a worthwhile exercise looking at the websites of Chippenham, Shrewsbury and Kendal Town Councils to see the different approaches taken by these town councils to manage really important non-statutory amenities such as parks and museums within a unitary authority."
